Question #1: What mistakes were made during employment?

a) The first mistake was made when man (A) didn't tell the woman involved that he was married.

This first mistake lead the woman on in her persuite, and could have been alleviated if man (A) acted a little more normal in his social appearance.

This also would have enabled her to gather more information, not only from one man but from two.

note: The best position in my opinion was for man (B) to say to the woman that man (A)'s business was none of his (man B's) business to speak on his behalf (man A). And in doing this would have helped in ^{not} perpetuating this problem.

I'm not saying that he shouldn't of gathered information but he didn't have ~~say~~ to say some of the things he did in response to some of her questions or statements.

F) The sixth mistake was when man (A) asked the woman for addresses of some of her relatives.

This lead the woman to feel that man (A) might of had some intentions of actually kidnapping her which might have been supported by man (B's) statements.
