SYNOPSIS:

This case involvement in the bomb sweep and checking out suspicious packages at the above address.

DETAILS:

I was requested by Homicide to respond to 739 E 6th Street reference a strange odor coming from the house which a homicide had just occurred. Because of the nature of the homicide they wanted the Bomb Squad to check it for potential booby traps. Detective Weadock and I had occasion to smell the odor and it smelled like some type of pesticide or solvent. Tucson Fire Department's Hazardous Team also responded and took monitoring samples of the area. However, prior to that Detective Weadock and I donned Scot Air Packs in energy residence wearing rubber gloves and foot coverings to preserve any evidence that may be in the residence. After doing a sweep we did not locate any explosives or booby traps. The odor in which Det. Weadock and I smelled seemed to be emitting from the body and around the floor area in which the victim was lying in. The odor was not noticed in any other part of the residence, at any strong locations other than in the atmosphere. We advised Sgt. Armijo of our findings and then left the scene while TFD Hazardous Material remained at the scene to continue sampling of the air to determine the exact type of odor.

Approximately 3 hours later we were than notified by Capt. Ulichny to respond to the residence of the wife of Mr. Rashad Abdell Khalifa to x-ray a suspicious package left in the bell box. Upon arrival Mrs. Khalifa was not expecting the package which time Det. Weadock and I set up the portable x-ray machine, x-rayed the package and found that it contained a bottle of some type of medication of pills. Mrs. Khalifa had then stated that she was expecting a vitamin order from the return address which on the package. We also had occasion to respond back to the area of 739 E. 6th Street to do radiographs of several pieces of bulk mail for any suspected explosive devices. However, all these items turned up negative.
